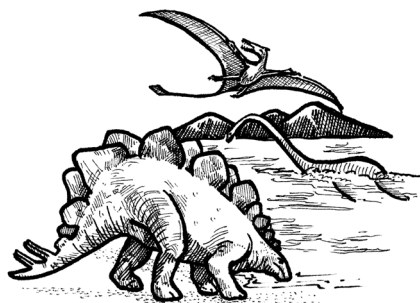
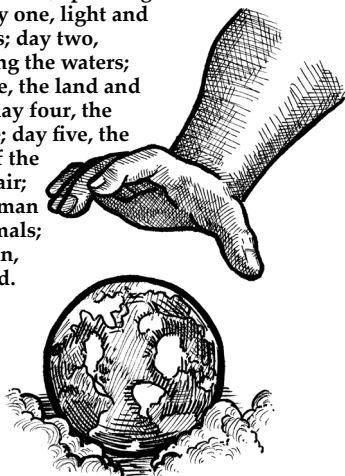


The Creation c. 5000 B.C.

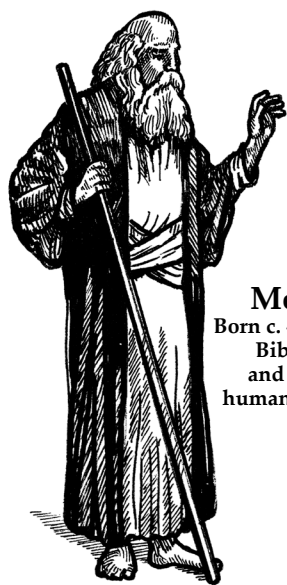
The Dinosaurs

5th and 6th days of Creation
Deriving from the Greek *deinos* meaning "terrifying" and *sauros* meaning "lizard," these often gigantic reptiles have mostly reached extinction. They were generally referred to as *behemoth* and *leviathan* in the Old Testament.

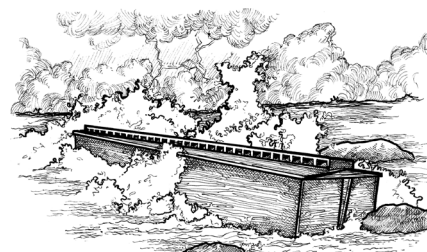
Methuselah

The first sons of Adam and Eve. Due to his jealousy of his brother Abel, Cain murdered him and was subsequently banished.



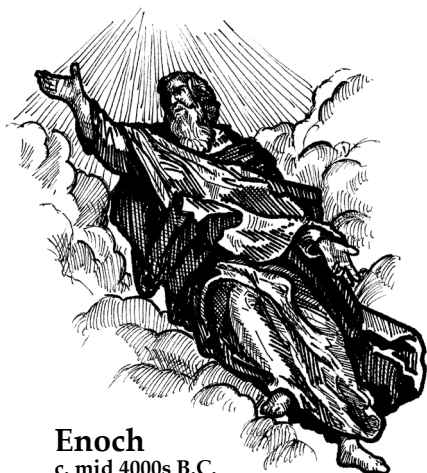
Noah and the Flood

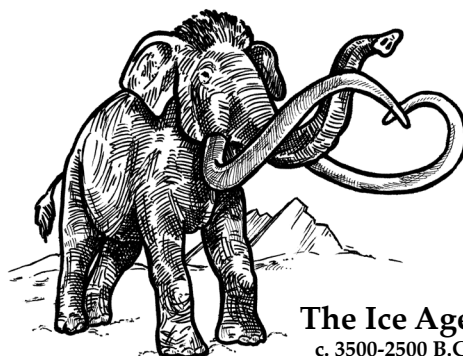
Jubal and Tubal-Cain c. 4500 B.C.

Descendants of Cain, Jubal is known for his invention of the harp and lyre. Tubal-Cain mastered working with iron and bronze.



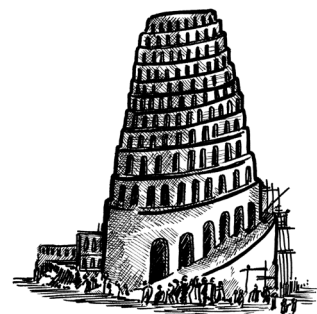
Enoch
