



John

first century A.D.

Known as "the Divine" or "the Evangelist," one of the twelve disciples, brother of James (the elder), and author of three epistles, the fourth Gospel, and the *Book of Revelation*.



Thaddaeus

first century A.D.

Also known as Lebbaeus, one of the twelve disciples, and brother of James (the lesser).



Matthew

first century A.D.

Originally a tax collector, one of the twelve disciples and author of the first Gospel of the New Testament.



Philip

first century A.D.

One of the twelve disciples and present at the feeding of the 5,000.



Simon

first century A.D.

Surnamed "the Zealot" and "the Canaanite," and one of the twelve disciples, he preached in Babylonia and Persia. He died a martyr.



Thomas

first century A.D.

One of the twelve disciples, he doubted Jesus' resurrection until he saw the nail wounds, coining the phrase "doubting Thomas."
