



French Foreign Legion
1831 A.D. A professional fighting unit composed of international volunteers, the Légion Étrangère was originally designed to serve as a military presence in France's African colonies.



Lewis Carroll
1832-1898 A.D. Pen name for Charles Lutwidge Dodgson, this British mathematician and author is known for his novels *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* and *Through the Looking-Glass*, written for the amusement of a friend's young daughter, Alice Liddell.



Édouard Manet
1832-1883 A.D. French artist and predecessor of impressionism, noted for such paintings as *The Balcony* and *The Luncheon in the Studio*.



James Hudson Taylor
1832-1905 A.D. English missionary who began his mission to China in 1854 working in hospitals. He also translated the New Testament into the Ningpo language and founded the China Inland Mission.

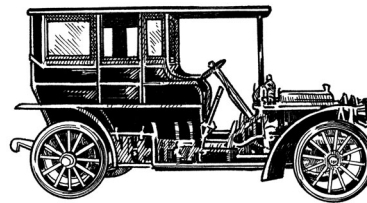


British Abolition Act of 1833 A.D.

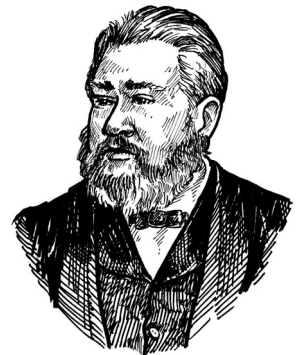
British humanitarians fought to abolish slavery, successfully outlawing slave trade in 1807. Their work continued until the passing of the Abolition Act of 1833. Gradual abolition followed throughout all lands under British control.



Johannes Brahms
1833-1897 A.D. German composer whose many romantic and classic compositions included chamber music, concertos, symphonies, and choral works such as *A German Requiem*.



Gottlieb Wilhelm Daimler
1834-1900 A.D. German engineer who developed the first high-speed internal combustion engine in 1885. Founding a company that manufactured motor cars in 1890, his cars were named "Mercedes," after the daughter of an Austrian businessman.



Charles Haddon Spurgeon
1834-1892 A.D. English Baptist minister known for his compelling preaching. He wrote more material than any other Christian author and is still changing lives today.



(Hilaire Germain) Edgar Degas

1834-1917 A.D. French sculptor and painter particularly known for his contemporary and fluid works of ballet dancers, such as *Ballet Dancers in the Wings*.



Dwight Lyman Moody

1837-1899 A.D. American Evangelist who preached throughout England and founded many educational institutions, including Moody Bible Institute in 1899.



Modest Petrovich Mussorgsky

1839-1881 A.D. Russian composer whose well-loved piano suite, *Pictures at an Exhibition*, has been orchestrated by Ravel and others. His best known works include the opera *Boris Godunov*.



Paul Cézanne

1839-1906 A.D. French post-impressionist artist whose ideas in the painted form led to the development of cubism. Among his popular works are *The Card Players* and *Mont Sainte-Victoire*.
